String Orchestra To Perform At Bridgewater

The Russian String Orchestra will present a lyceum at 7:30 p.m. Oct. 17 in the Carter Center for Worship and Music at Bridgewater College.

Founded in 1991 by music director Misha Rachlevsky as the Chamber Orchestra Kremlin, the orchestra consists of some of Russia's finest young string players. The group's warmth and high energy create addictive performances that stay with listeners long after the last note has been played.

The orchestra's repertoire includes approximately 1,000 compositions with more than 20 being written especially for the orchestra by Russian composers.

In addition to performing in Moscow, the orchestra has performed in 24 countries in Europe, North and South America and the Far East.

The orchestra has recorded more than 30 CDs and has received international acclaim, including the Diapason d'Or award in France, Critics Choice in London's Gramophone, Critics Choice in The New York Times and Record of the Year award in Hong Kong.

The event is free to the public.
